STRICKLANDS IN ATLANTA, GEORGIA

The following biographical sketches are from ATLANTA AND ENVIRONS, A Chronicle Of Its People and Events, Family and Personal History, Volume III, published by Lewis Historical Publishing Company, Inc., 1954.

PAUL BRIDGES STRICKLAND - From the early years of the century Paul Bridges Strickland has been engaged in the hardware business in Atlanta, and is now vice president of the Beck Gregg Hardware Company. Born on June 27, 1883 near Concord, Georgia, Mr. Strickland is the son of James Carey and Martha Rebecca (Oxford) Strickland, both of whom were natives of the state of Georgia. James Carey Strickland was a farmer by occupation, who served with Doles Cook's Brigade of the 44th Georgia Regiment, Confederate States Army....In 1905 Mr. Strickland (Paul) came to Atlanta, which has been his home since. He was first connected with the Anderson Hardware Company, remaining there until 1912. The following year he formed the connection in which he has continued since...Mr. Strickland is not a fraternalist, but he is a devoted worker in the cause of the Baptist Church. He is unmarried.

FREEMAN STRICKLAND is a senior vice president of the First National Bank of Atlanta and has been with that bank and predecessor organizations from the beginning of his career. He is likewise a leader in the affairs of his city and the cause of education. Born September 17, 1902, in La Grange, Freeman Strickland is a son of Willis Howard Strickland, Sr., who is identified as owner with the Coca-Cola Bottling Company of Richland, and is active in several other business connections. Willis Howard Strickland was born in Troup County, August 6, 1878, son of W. W. and Susan (Fuller) Strickland, the former a native of Troup County and the latter of Fredonia.

On December 26, 1900, Willis Howard Strickland married Ruth Freeman of Troup County. They became the parents of three sons: 1. Freeman; 2. Willis Howard, Jr.; 3. Leon...In Atlanta on September 17, 1932, Freeman Strickland married Ruth Rowbotham, daughter of George Walter and Charlotte (Chapman) Rowbotham. Mr. and Mrs. Strickland are the parents of two children: 1. Ruth R., who was born on January 16, 1936; 2. Freeman, Jr., born March 6, 1938. The family resides at 998 Stovall Boulevard, Northeast...and attend Peachtree Road Methodist Church.

(Editor's Note: In 1954, a 3 volume set, ATLANTA AND ENVIRONS, was published. Mr. Franklin Miller Garrett, noted Atlanta historian, was the author of the first two volumes which are considered the most extensive books ever written on the history of Atlanta.)

OBITUARY OF ELIZABETH STRICKLAND McCONNELL, June 3, 1873.

"Intelligence has reached me of the death of sister ELIZABETH McCONNELL, wife of ISAAC McCONNELL, formerly of Cherokee county, Ga., now living in Parker county, Texas. Her numerous friends in Georgia will feel sad to hear of this, for she was highly esteemed by all who knew her. It was my good fortune to be often at her happy home. I was with the family the last night they spent in their house in Georgia, and witnessed some of the last farewells of her neighbors. I remember her sweet, cheerful, hopeful spirit, how ready she was to go to Texas for the future welfare of her children. She seemed to live to make others happy. She was a loving wife and mother, a good neighbor, and above all a devoted Christian. She was born August 22d, 1820, near Lawranceville, Ga., joined the Church in 1830, and died June 3, 1873. Her husband writes, "My wife has been confined to her room and bed for the last eight months, gradually growing worse until the 3d day of June, when she died, remaining in her usual mind to the last, and asking us not to grieve for her. A while before she died, she said, 'Is this death? If so, I never felt so sweet.' She died in the full triumphs of a gospel faith. I have no doubts of her acceptance with God." Wm. A. SIMMONS.

WAYSIDE HOME REGISTER, UNION POINT, GREENE COUNTY, GEORGIA

SEPTEMBER 1862 - JUNE 1864

20, 434 Confederate soldiers, sailors and marines registered at the Wayside Home in Union Point, Georgia. More than 1,000,000 meals were served to Confederates passing through. Hundreds were fed on trains that were not registered. The ladies of Union Point operated this home. Stricklands who registered were:

1864 REORGANIZATION OF THE GEORGIA MILITIA

Early in 1864, a census was taken throughout Georgia (by Act of the Legislature in 1863) to determine the men, between the ages of 16 & 60, who were either exempt or were eligible to serve in the Georgia Militia. The following Stricklands were listed in Meriwether County.

In the Name of God Amen.

I, Zadok Strickland of the County of Nash and State of North Carolina being of sound and disposing mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of mortal life do make and declare this my last will and Testament in manner and form viz

- 1st. - 2nd. At the death or marriage of my said wife Rebecca Strickland the above named tract of land shall descend in like manner to my daughter in law Amey Strickland, and at her death or marriage I give and bequeath the said tract of land to my three Grandchildren viz. Joseph A., Susan A. R. and (illegible) Strickland, to be equally divided among them share and share alike but the other articles of property loaned to my wife shall be sold by my Executor after her death and the proceeds thereof disposed of in like manner with the balance of my Estate not otherwise disposed of.

- 3rd. I give to my son Allison Strickland one hundred Acres of land to be cut off from the South West corner of the tract whereon I now live, on the Bidatœ branch adjoining the lands of Sion Sanders and F. K. W. Strickland to him and his heirs forever.
- 4th. I give to my son Maddison Strickland twenty dollars as his portion in my Estate to him and his heirs forever.
- 5th. My will and desire is that the residue of my estate after my death be sold by my Executor and the proceeds thereof be equally divided among Renny Taylor, wife of Ruffin Taylor, Roenny Perry, wife of Hilliard Perry, Nancy Morgan, wife of Evan H. Morgan, Allison Strickland, Redden Strickland, Susan Rooker, wife of Presley Rooker, Charity Bergeron, wife of Elias Bergeron and the heirs of C. O. Strickland.
- 6th. I hereby constitute and appoint my trusty and beloved Son Allison Strickland my lawful Executor to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same, hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made in witness whereof I the said Zadok Strickland do hereunto set my hand and seal this the 30th day of August A.D. 1860.

My thanks to Freeman Strickland who wrote to Brenda Bailey of Aliceville, AL, and mentioned my research. We exchanged information and found that she was a cousin, being descended from Brinkley Strickland of NC and Pickens Co., AL. Brinkley was a brother of my great grandfather, Obediah Powell Strickland. By comparing land deeds, family legend and census records, we have established that:-

Obediah Powell Strickland, Abel Strickland (b. 1804) and Greene Strickland (b. 1810) were all brothers living adjoining each other in Pickens Co., AL, from 1840 to 1866. Obediah Strickland Sr. (b. Franklin Co., NC, 1763 - d. Pickens Co., AL, 1842) was their father. Their mother was Winnie _____. Obediah Sr. is buried on land owned by Obediah Powell Strickland at the time.

Brenda Bailey's grandmother knew that her great great grandfather Brinkley Strickland (b. 1785, NC) was the son of Obediah Strickland Sr. So, it appears we have found the missing link after all. Obediah Strickland Sr. is the son of Samson (Sampson) and Christina (Christiana), and brother to Abel, Lott, Braswell (Brasil), Matthew, and Samson Jr.
